'This is the genealogy¹ of Jesus the Messiah¹ the son of David, the son of Abraham' (Matthew 1:1)

The Church Council will hold its next meeting on Monday, July 8, at 7 p.m., in the lower level of the church. For more information, please contact Jane Ahrens.




Memorial Service for Don Palmer

At 4:50 p.m. on April 16, we welcomed our daughter into the world, 8 days after her due date and nearly 10 years after we first started trying to have children. In other words, right on time.

We named her Elizabeth Hope. Elizabeth is Rachel's middle name, and I (Rollin) believe one reason God has given us a girl is to honor Rachel—to honor the faith, humility, and courage that Rachel had manifested through our journey of infertility. My prayer is that our little girl would inherit and perpetuate her mother's legacy. As a result, I wanted her name to connect her with Rachel, and we figured Elizabeth was probably a better idea than Rachel Jr.

Rachel researched the etymology of "Elizabeth." It's a transliteration of the Hebrew name meaning God's promise or God is my oath. This association sold

Rachel on the

name. It captured a key theme of her own journey through our infertility. We took a while to settle on the middle name. We wanted the middle name to connect to our story as well. Eventually, we decided on "Hope." This is our hoped for child. She is a sign of hope for others. And we pray she becomes a woman of deep, joyful, and preserving hope, no matter the circumstances, just like her mother.

Elizabeth was 8lbs, 8oz at birth and the whole nursing staff commented on her big feet.

Apparently she inherited at least one thing from her daddy.

After many updates and prayer requests, we are overjoyed to finally get to share this update! The first time we ever asked for prayer for a baby was October, 2016.

You have been more than our ministry partners—you have been our friends, our community, our advocates.

We have spent many years partnered with you in working to see students at Texas A&M become lifelong disciples of Jesus, for the glory of God and the good of the world.

Now, we ask for your prayer for God to help us parent Elizabeth in a way that contributes to her becoming a lifelong disciple of Jesus, for the glory of God and the good of the world.
